


HOUSE OF THE TEMPLE

• Renovation Update for November 2010 •

DURING NOVEMBER 2010, the Renovation Team focused on completing the Investigation Report and preparing for upgrading life safety within the House of the Temple. Over 40 investigations were conducted and documented in the last few months providing valuable information about how the House of the Temple was built originally and renovated subsequently. Over the course of the next month additional handrails, fire alarm annunciators and smoke detectors will be added throughout the House of the Temple.



The *Investigation Report* documenting the various interior and exterior investigations including moat foundations, water table level, structural composition of the masonry walls and mechanical/plumbing chases was completed in November 2010.



Moisture was observed in the northeast corner of the oculus in Temple Room ceiling. The Renovation Team investigated the space between the laylight and skylight during the next heavy rain storm. The image above shows the skylight and supporting structure.




View of oculus glass from just below the skylight framing. No evidence of water was noticed during the time spent in this area. The Renovation Team will continue to monitor the space to determine the source for the water infiltration.



The rain leader from the skylight gutter in the northeast corner has been replaced with PVC piping. Original rail leaders were iron pipes.
