
HOUSE OF THE TEMPLE



· Renovation Update for August 2011 ·

URING AUGUST 2011, the Renovation Team installed the first three finials in the new handrail leading from the Entrance level to the Banquet Hall. The unexpected 5.8 earthquake on August 23, 2011, caused minor damage in the House of Temple. Representatives from the structural engineer have reviewed the building noting their concerns. Design work is ongoing with focus on the accessible entrance, plumbing (including additional restrooms), and electrical design including lighting.



The "Lost Wax" process was used for casting the new finials. First, a pattern of the historic finial was hand carved. Using the pattern, a mold was created to make the wax castings. The funnel-shaped element and rods are a "pour cup" to allow the molten metal to be poured in and gases escape.



Fine aggregate (sand) is then "painted" onto the wax mold, with successive layers of more course aggregate added to create a "shell". The shell is then baked at high temperature. The wax melts leaving the shell which can then be filled with the molten metal.



One of the rays from the "glory" on the West Elevation of the Temple Room became detached from the window as a result of the earthquake. Five panes of glass were also cracked or broken during this event. Conservators have reviewed the situation and proposed a methodology to reattach and stabilize the loose element.



The stone fragments on the stairs outside the Temple Room are from a crack in the marble wall above which resulted from the earthquake.
