

GUIDELINES FOR THE JACK LONDON SUPREME COUNCIL ROTC (Reserve Officer Training Corps) AWARD for Colleges and Universities



General: The Scottish Rite of Freemasonry is a fraternal organization first established in Charleston, South Carolina, in 1801. The Scottish Rite and its members help communities across the nation every day through scholarships, the RiteCare Scottish Rite Childhood Language Program, the Scottish Rite for Children Hospitals, and other programs.





Dr. J. Phillip “Jack” London, 33°, was the Executive Chairman and Chairman of the Board of CACI International Inc (NYSE) from 2007 until his death in January 2021. He was a Navy veteran and a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. Jack was a 33° Scottish Rite Mason and a strong advocate for ROTC programs.

Description: Approved by the Assistant Secretary of Defense, the Scottish Rite ROTC Award consists of a medal, ribbon, and certificate. The medal depicts the heraldic logo of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry and the words “ROTC Education and Americanism,” which call attention to two of the major focal points of the Scottish Rite.

Purpose: This award recognizes one outstanding cadet in his or her second or third year of a four-year program. To assist in preparation, a sample copy of the completed certificate is included in the award package.

Eligibility:

The cadet must:

-  Have contributed the most among cadets on campus to encourage and demonstrate patriotism by deeds or conduct during participation in extracurricular activities or community projects;
-  Have demonstrated academic excellence by being in the top 25% of his or her academic class;
-  Have demonstrated a potential for outstanding leadership by exhibiting qualities of dependability, good character, self-discipline, good citizenship, and patriotism;
-  Have not previously received this award.

Selection: The senior officer or professor of Military/Naval Science will make the selection.

Administration: The Supreme Council is divided into two Jurisdictions, the Southern Jurisdiction and Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.
